

## ***INDIVIDUAL SOURCE REPORT 2--UOnline***

UOnline is part of the regular University of Utah course system [<https://uonline.utah.edu/>]. All courses administered by the UOnline program are sections of University Courses, sponsored by individual departments. The courses are for college credit and are semester based (i.e. they follow the university calendar).

The Technology Assisted Curriculum Center (TACC), located in the Marriott Library, provides the fully online courses of UOnline, utilizing the Courseware Management System WebCT. A variety of University of Utah Academic Departments provide online classes which are identical to traditional on-campus classes, with the obvious exception that there is no need for the instructor to meet with students in the same geographical location; there are no classroom meetings, albeit some instructors require proctored exams (extension sites and out-of-area proctors are available options for off-campus students).

For Spring Semester 2008 alone, UOnline offered **160** unique courses with an enrollment of almost 5400 students. A snapshot of the steady growth experienced by UOnline courses and their student enrollments between Fall Semester 2000 and Spring Semester 2008 is reflected in charts available at <https://uonline.utah.edu/html/statistics.html> and is included below.

Total enrollments increased by five times over an eight year period, with a corresponding 80% increase in the number of UOnline courses offered. The trend in both number of distance education courses offered online and their enrollments is an undeniable upward slope.
